PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Indiana – Franklin Masonic Lodge # 313 Scholarship Program awards scholarships to deserving students wishing to further their education. The program is administered by an appointed committee of four members of the Indiana – Franklin Masonic Lodge # 313. Members of the committee are appointed by the Worshipful Master prior to the ensuing calendar year.

ELIGIBILITY

To apply for The Indiana – Franklin Masonic Lodge # 313 Scholarship a student must:

1. Be a member in good standing of Indiana – Franklin Masonic Lodge # 313, be a child, grandchild or spouse of a member in good standing of Indiana – Franklin Masonic Lodge # 313 (or who was in good standing at the time of his death).
2. Be a resident of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
3. Have an average or above average academic record. Standardized Test scores should be the following: a minimum score of 18 for the ACT composite OR a minimum combined verbal and math score of 850 for the SAT. These requirements are general guidelines.
4. Be enrolled or plan to enroll in a two year or four year college, university, vocational or technical school.

SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS AND AMOUNTS

Scholarship awards from The Indiana – Franklin Masonic Lodge # 313 Scholarship Program are awarded for tuition purposes and are generally in the range of \$500.00 to \$1,000.00. The monetary amount of awards may vary from year to year based on the condition of the Scholarship Fund. Awards will be made payable to the student's school and mailed to the recipient's home address.

APPLICATION PROCEDURES

Interested students must complete the attached application and submit it, along with a current, complete official transcript of grades to The Indiana – Franklin Masonic Lodge # 313 Scholarship Program Committee. **Applications must be received and/or postmarked no later than April 15, 2011.** All information requested on the application must be completed to be eligible. All information received is considered confidential and will be reviewed only by The Indiana – Franklin Masonic Lodge # 313 Scholarship Program Committee.

SELECTION OF SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS

The Indiana – Franklin Masonic Lodge # 313 Scholarship Program Committee will review all applications received to first ensure eligibility. The recipients will be chosen based on academic achievement, demonstrated leadership and participation in school and community activities, honors, goals and aspirations as outlined in the application. The recipients will be notified by early May, 2011.

SCHOLARSHIP CONDITIONS AND OBLIGATIONS

Upon being awarded a scholarship the student must enroll as a full time student in the fall of the year in which the scholarship was awarded and supply The Indiana – Franklin Masonic Lodge # 313 Scholarship Program Committee with complete transcripts when requested.
